

Evaluation of AGICC U-16 players

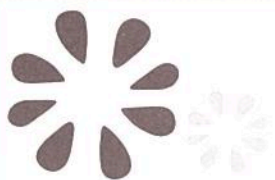

My evaluation was based on the following points.

- Batting

- agility
- endurance
- Fitness level

Kids (Young adults) who participated in this evaluation process were playing cricket with Cricket Academy USA (CAUSA) for past 4 plus years and have been efficiently trained with leather ball (regular size - not youth). Their skill level was assessed in a manner considering them to be adults and my session with them was conducted in a lighted batting cage with full run-up and a standard 22 yard pitch.

Hello Dr. Pore,

I am the founder and Board member at California Cricket academy (www.calcricket.org), a premier youth cricket academy in USA based in Silicon Valley. California Cricket Academy (CCA) is established in 2003 and thousands of players have gone thru training at our academy. We train players 6 to 17.

As part of our program, we focus on fitness, Technical training and Games. Games are crucial part of their development. Upto age 13, boys and girls exclusively focus on their age group or maximum one or two age groups above their age limit. Once boys reaches 14, we assess their skill level and recommend them to play Adult league. Atleast 20 players from CCA are currently playing in the adult league between the age 14 and 16. In our North West region there are many more than that playing in adult league. If player is talented we feel comfortable challenging him in lower division of Adult league as there are enough protective gears they wear.



World Wide Cricket Academy (the "Academy") consists of young cricketers from the age group of around 5 years to senior adult cricketers trained under the supervision of seasoned coaches. The Academy participates in adult cricket leagues indicated above throughout the year in different formats (T20, 30 overs, 35 overs and 40 overs). The team typically consists of majority of youth cricketers playing alongside 3 to 4 seasoned adult cricketer mentors. The inclusion of a youth cricketer into the team for matches is determined by the coaches based on their level of physical fitness, skill and preparedness from a safety standpoint. Younger cricketers are typically placed in outfield at positions to safeguard safety. Likewise batting positions for younger cricketers is suitably allotted to safeguard safety.

The Academy has been successful in winning championships in different leagues across different formats.
